

# PROCLAMATION

## National Public Works Week May 19–25, 2024 “Advancing Quality of Life For All”

**WHEREAS**, public works professionals focus on infrastructure, facilities, and services that are of vital importance to sustainable and resilient communities and to the public health, high quality of life, and well-being of the people of Marlboro Township; and,



**WHEREAS**, these infrastructure, facilities, and services could not be provided without the dedicated efforts of public works professionals, who are engineers, managers, and employees at all levels of government and the private sector, who are responsible for rebuilding, improving, and protecting our nation's transportation, water supply, water treatment and solid waste systems, public buildings, and other structures and facilities essential for our citizens; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Marlboro Department of Public Works, led by Director Robert Miller, maintains 230 miles of road, 773 streets, 16 facilities, 15 parks, 19 athletic fields, 83 open space parcels, 117 storm basins and 8,963 water connections; and

**WHEREAS**, it is in the public interest for the citizens, civic leaders, and children of Marlboro Township to gain knowledge of and maintain an ongoing interest and understanding of the importance of public works and public works programs in our community; and,

**WHEREAS**, the year 2024 marks the 64<sup>th</sup> annual National Public Works Week sponsored by the American Public Works Association/Canadian Public Works Association.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, Jonathan L. Hornik, Mayor of the Township of Marlboro, along with the Township Council, do hereby designate the week May 19–25, 2024, as National Public Works Week. I urge all citizens to join with representatives of the American Public Works Association and government agencies to pay tribute to our public works professionals, engineers, managers, and employees and to recognize the substantial contributions they make to protecting our national health, safety, and advancing quality of life for all.
